USE OF CELL PHONES**

## Company Policy

The use of Cell Phones, iPods, MP3 Players, Bluetooth Devices, and any other device that uses Ear Buds or similar ear devices are NOT allowed while driving any Company vehicle.

Receiving or sending TEXT messages while driving any Company vehicle is strictly forbidden and NOT allowed.

Per USDOT - Truck and bus drivers who are texting while driving commercial vehicles may be subject to civil or criminal penalties of up to \$2,750. The employee is responsible for paying this fine.

Some drivers are required to carry a company provided cell phone when working, as a condition of employment for AA Transportation.

However, Massachusetts state law prohibits the use cell phones, I Pods, MP3 Players, Bluetooth devices,

and any device that uses Ear Buds or similar ear devices, by the driver when the vehicle is in motion.

In the event the driver receives a call while driving, the driver must stop the vehicle in a safe parking area to answer or return the call.

In the event of an emergency, to report an accident to the office, to call for police assistance, or to call for medical assistance for a passenger or employee who may be injured while riding on your vehicle, the driver must stop the vehicle in a safe parking area to make the emergency call.

Many customers feel unsafe while riding with a driver who is using a cell phone (hands free or not). Customers feel that the driver is not giving 100% of their attention to driving the vehicle, and "they are right".

This policy applies to all employees of each Company. If you need to make or receive a call stop, park and secure your vehicle in a safe location, then make or receive your call.
